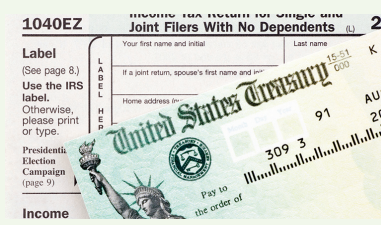
## Save on Efficient Appliances

Starting in October 2024, low- and middle-income families will be able to purchase new appliances like ovens, furnaces and electric panels at steep discounts, thanks to federal funding.

## Tax Resources

Looking to save on your taxes and lower your utility bills? New federal tax credits can save you up to 30% on geothermal and battery installations, up to \$7,500 on used and new electric cars, \$1,200 on weatherizing your home, and \$2,000 on a new water heater. ## Clean Energy Resources

- Water heating makes up about 90% of energy used by clothes washers. Using cold water decreases energy use.
- Replace your light bulbs with energy efficient bulbs.
- Open your curtains during the daytime to allow the sun to naturally heat your home.
- By turning your thermostat down 10-15 degrees while at work, you can save about 10% a year on heating bills.
