## Save on Efficient Appliances

The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 includes hundreds of millions of dollars for Michigan homeowners to lower their utility bills. Starting in October 2024, low- and middle-income families will be able to purchase new appliances like ovens, furnaces and electric panels at steep discounts, thanks to federal funding.

## Tax Resources

Looking to save on your taxes and lower your utility bills? New federal tax credits can save you up to 30% on geothermal and battery installations, up to \$7,500 on used and new electric cars, \$1,200 on weatherizing your home, and \$2,000 on a new water heater. 

# **Clean, Affordable, Reliable Energy**


