- Secured **\$31.3 million** last fall to pay off debt for the Muskegon Heights Public School District.
- Provided **\$87 million** for literacy-related curricula, professional development, and tools to help improve student's reading abilities.
- Invested **\$200 million** providing free school breakfast and lunch for all public PreK-12 students.
- Allocated an additional **\$365.3 million** more for special education services.



More Kids in Quality Preschool

The state has expanded its Great Start Readiness Program to make preschool available for every family, so every eligible child can access a high-quality early education. One year of high-quality preschool increases the likelihood of literacy, graduating from high school and moving on to college. End to end, every major life outcome is affected. I can't think of a better investment for long-term prosperity.

Affordable Child Care for Working Families

As chair of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Economic Development, and Lifelong Learning, I'm proud to announce that the recent state budget included over **\$440 million** to make child care more affordable for working families. We've also included **\$29 million** to increase the number of child care options for Michigan families. I'll never stop working to make sure working parents can afford to raise a family.



Rep. Snyder is Making Community College Affordable

Everyone deserves access to higher education. That's why I have always supported and will continue to support low-cost community college for Michigan high school graduates. I am proud to say that the recent state budget allocated an additional \$9 million for community college operations. Universal Meals for Public-School Students

Providing universal breakfast and lunch for public-school students wasn't just a necessity — it was
